The discussion in this course is divided into three major topic groups, namely the definition of the political system which includes units, functions, capacities, and the environment of the political system. The second topic is about the dynamics of interaction between the military, interest groups, the bureaucracy, and political parties in Indonesia. The third topic is the periodization of the Indonesian political system which includes Liberal, Guided Democracy, Pancasila, and democratic transition.
